== ユースギョン 実施概要 2006年に誕生したアメリカの国際学術ジャーナル『メカデミア』。京都精華大 学国際マンガ研究センターでは、2018年から2年に1回、メカデミアとの共催で国際学 術会議を開いている。「Ecologies」というテーマのもと、当初2020年の開催を目指してい たが、新型コロナウイルス感染症(COVID-19)蔓延のため1年延期され、2021年にオン ラインで開催されることになった。2日間の開催期間中、北アメリカ、南アメリカ、アジア、 ヨーロッパなど、世界中から参加した73人の研究者による発表と熱い議論が行われた。• テーマの「Ecologies」は、「環境的」という意味だけではなく、ここでは、「メディアエコロ ジー」や「メディア生態学」をも指す言葉として使われている。このテーマにふさわしく、マン ガ、アニメ、ゲームなど、幅広い分野が研究発表の対象となった。

●シカゴ大学教授、ア ニメ研究者のトーマス・ラマール氏は、「メディアエコロジー テレビとアニメーション」という 題で基調講演を行い、1997年に日本で発生した「ポケモンショック」事件をメディア研究 の観点から語った。また、もう一人のキーノートスピーカー・天神英貴氏により、アニメ業 界のメカニックデザインやマーケティングの話などが実体験を交えて紹介された。●本会議 は、これまでのメカデミア国際学術会議史上、最大規模となった。参加者が発表を見 られる十分な時間を確保できるよう、大会の2週間前から研究発表の動画がオンライン で公開され、開催当日はリアルタイムで質疑応答を行う形をとった。そうしたことで、参加 者の満足度も非常に高く、良質な議論を交わすこともできた。内容、形式ともに、今後の 学術イベントを考える上で参考となる一つの例になったと言える。 [文責=ユースギョン]
